## Ms Margaret Banks - Keynote Speaker

Margaret Banks has worked as the Senior Program Director with the Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care since July 2006. In this time she has worked with stakeholders, consumers and jurisdictions on the development of National Safety and Quality Health Service (NSQHS) Standards and a program of systematic accreditation reform for the implementation of the NSQHS Standards.

Prior to this appointment Margaret worked with the Department of Health and Ageing, the Australian Health Workforce Advisory Committee and the NSW Health Department on matters relating to workforce.

She has also worked as a physiotherapist for 9 years in both Australia and Papua New Guinea, and held an Adjunct Professorship with the University of Technology Sydney.

Mrs Royle began her career as a nurse at the Queen Victoria Memorial Hospital in Melbourne in 1974. In 1992, she became the Director of Nursing at Mitcham Private Hospital in Melbourne, and three years later she became the Executive Director of Ringwood Private Hospital.
